Quash penalties: Former defender Debjit Ghosh was today said to have been fined Rs 1 lakh and suspended for a year for beating up, as Karim's current coach, a referee and a match commissioner during a Calcutta Football League match. A source in the Calcutta Referees' Association told "The Statesman" "in continuation of the punishment had been imposed yesterday by the Indian Football Association. Disciplinary deliberations were said to have been held before the penal action was taken and Ghosh was claimed to have acknowledged his guilt. It was additionally said that the suspension would be extended by a year if the fine was not paid.

India eye series-leveling win over West Indies

The need of the hour for India is for bigger contributions from the batting department in unison

After losing the first two T20I matches to the West Indies, India kept the five-game series alive with a resounding seven-wicket win in the third game, thanks to superior efforts from vice-captain Suryakumar Yadav and Titas Varma.

Now with the series action shifting to Laxdenhall in Florida, USA, for the last two matches, India will be hoping that other batters step up to make significant contributions in the fourth T20I happening on Saturday.

West Indies are still leading the series 2-1, owing to India's blunting batsman Varma not coming to the party. Though Suryakumar got back to his groove in the third T20I, India would require the likes of Yashwanth Jaiswal, Shubman Gill, captain Hardik Pandya and the rest of the lower-order batters to step up and play

a huge role in run-making. Gill has been dismissed for single digits in all three innings and is yet to reach double figures in the series till now. Jaiswal, brought in place of Ishan Kishan at the top, got out cheaply on his T20I debut.

With Hardik yet to find his peak form with the bat and India's tail starting from number eight, the need of the hour is for bigger contributions from the batting department in unison. In the bowling department, Kuldeep Yadav, Axar Patel and Yuvendra Chahal have been impressive as a spin outfit, while Arshdeep Singh and Mukesh Kumar are doing a tidy job for the West Indies, building up to next year's T20 World Cup at home, there is a chance for them to win back-to-back T20I series for the first time since 2017 if they manage to beat India on Saturday.

Just like India, West Indies batters haven't clicked in unison, with Nicholas Pooran in the midst of a purple patch and captain Rovman Powell providing big hits to some extent. Kyle Mayers, Shimron Hetmyer and Brandon King need to stand up with the bat if West Indies are to pose a strong challenge to India.

The two teams have played six T20Is in their face-offs at Laxdenhall, with India winning four games, West Indies just once, and the other one being washed out. Bill Overman draft: England batter Alex Hales, West Indies wicketkeeper-batter Nicholas Pooran and South Africa duo of Faf du Plessis and Kilee Rossouw are among the six batters to be nominated for the upcoming overseas draft of the Big Bash League (BBL) to be held on September 5. Pooran, who was recently in the spotlight for his mammoth 157 runs off 55 balls for MI New York in the Major League Cricket final, will be capturing the attention of multiple clubs ahead of the BBL, starting from December 7. His previous stint in the BBL came in the 2020-21 season where he made six appearances for Melbourne Stars. Sydney Thunder will be spoilt for choice with both Rossouw, who is ranked fourth in T20 batting and Hales, who retired recently from international cricket, ranked 131 and holder of an impressive BBL strike rate of 150.14. Both batters are available to the club as retention pick options. Meanwhile, du Plessis is returning for a second crack at the BBL, Overseas Player Draft, after scoring an impressive 177 runs from 125 balls in his eight matches for the Perth Scorchers in last year's BBL season, making him an appealing option as a retention pick. After helping the Brisbane Heat reach the final in last season, former New Zealand batter Cole Munro has his eyes set on another BBL season. Munro moved to the Brisbane Heat from the Perth Scorchers for BBL Season 12 after being selected as pick 11 in the inaugural BBL Draft and went on to have a big impact, scoring 378 runs across eight matches.

Little excitement around low-key derby

We are long past the time when the whole of Bengal split up into two intensely hostile camps named Mohan Bagan and East Bengal ahead of a derby, each cursing the other and muttering threats, much in the tradition of football derbies everywhere, sometimes complete with violent confrontations among their loyalists.

Tomorrow's 4 - 45 pm face-off at Salt Lake stadium is not really going to set pulses racing though, given that East Bengal have not won against Mohan Bagan for a long time and will struggle to face jampots of their skins if they pull it off for a change. It will be far community scrapbooks, embellished, piously. Social media's encyclopaedic collation of trivia suggests Bhaskar Ganguly, who has played in many Kolkata derbies himself, was asked the other day if he was going to roll up tomorrow at the ground, said that he might not, considering how badly East Bengal were doing, but then he was not sure he would not either. Maybe the give-and-take was half

to jest but it implied much less than the going-bo-splish in the red-and-gold brigade were once upon a happy time known for.

Mohan Bagan, in contrast, are nowadays all back and ginger when the derby comes around; they seem to take it for granted that they have it all wrapped up. All pundits opine in the run-up to tomorrow's encounter that the Durand Cup game, so early in the season, gives Mohan Bagan a gift-wrapped advantage as they hold on to a squad set substantially up last season with East Bengal, short on

cash, making do with whatever they stumble on at a late hour in the dwindling market. They can't really afford anything better in a game which, in the day of the Indian Super League, is increasingly about high salaries for players from exotic lands hawked by high-profile agents who must pocket their cuts in a system okayed by the country's national federation, inscrutable as it is in its wisdom. East Bengal have never won this match since they joined the ISL, which well-bred Mohan Bagan topped in the previous season even if inauthentic shoot-out victories marked important bits of their story of triumphs. They are dominating the Calcutta Football League, are to play a continental game days later and, of course, are expected widely to win tomorrow, even if there are those reminding people of the unpredictability of a derby. That is a bit of a noisier from the past, say others, pointing out East Bengal's steep decline. In the Durand cup, East Bengal have settled for a 2 - 2 draw with a team from Dhaka whom Mohan Bagan dubbed rather badly. East Bengal took in the goals after going up with a double strike. Making matters worse, their new Spanish coach pulled out a tonika of players while they were ahead. PK Banerjee, Anus Ghosh, Anil Datta or Sped Naemdin seldom allowed themselves that kind of foolhardy. Toughdays, there are, for them as Mohan Bagan taunt them for not taking the VIP tickets for their high-ups, saying that they do not really want to witness yet another day of merciless lamentering. It is for East Bengal to shine forth in renewed splendour but that will take some doing.

Shakib Al Hasan returns as Bangladesh's skipper for Asia Cup and ODI World Cup

Veteran left-arm spin all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan has made a return as Bangladesh's new skipper ahead of the upcoming Asia Cup and Men's ODI World Cup.

He replaces Tamim Iqbal, who had stepped down from the role earlier this month after being ruled out of the Asia Cup due to a back injury. Tamim had earlier announced his retirement from international cricket on July 10 but reversed the decision following a meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

"Shakib was the obvious

choice to captain Bangladesh when the position fell vacant. I am very confident that his exemplary performance,

experience, and leadership qualities will galvanise the team as we head into two massive events like the Asia Cup and the World Cup," said Narmal Hasan, President of the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB), in a statement.

Shakib is now the Bangladesh captain in all three formats after being appointed as captain of the Test and T20I teams last year. Shakib, 36, has previously led Bangladesh in 52 ODI matches between 2009 and 2017, including captaining the team in the 2011 ODI World Cup. Under him, Bangladesh won 23 ODIs while ending up on the losing side on 26 occasions.

Harry Kane agrees Bayern Munich move: England and Tottenham Hotspur striker Harry Kane has reportedly agreed to a four-year contract with the German champions Bayern Munich and will travel to Germany for a medical on Friday. After weeks of protracted talks, Bayern and Spurs agreed a deal worth more than £100 million (£80 million for the star striker. Kane was reportedly leaning towards staying in north London but now has agreed to join Bayern Munich in a deal worth more than £100 million and will be on a four-year contract at the Allianz Arena, Eurosport reported.
