Bomb threat in Kerala Secretariat turns out to be a hoax

A bomb threat caused some anxious moments at the Kerala government Secretariat, the seat of power that houses the offices of Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and other state ministers on Thursday. However, the threat that a bomb had been planted at the Kerala Secretariat turned out to be a hoax.

The police headquarters received a threat call by 11.30 am. The caller threatened to blow up the Secretariat using explosives.

As soon as the call came, Kerala Police's bomb detection and disposal squad scanned the building and its precincts with electronic detectors and sniffer dogs. The police also searched vehicles parked outside the premises for hidden explosives.

However, no explosives were found and it was revealed that the call was fake.

The police soon rounded up a 30-year-old man from Puzhappur near the city for allegedly making the threat call. The police said he was mentally challenged and had no sinister intention behind making the threatening call.

Centre asks Punjab to stop stubble burning

38% of air pollution in Delhi and neighbouring areas was found to be contributed by stubble burning

An emergency meeting held by Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gaudha has found that 38 per cent of air pollution in the national capital and neighbouring areas was contributed by stubble burning on 8 November.

The meeting chaired by the Cabinet Secretary was held as per the direction of the Supreme Court. Chief secretaries and officers-in-charge of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan and the NCT of Delhi attended the meeting.

The chairman, Commission on Air Quality Management (CAQM) and Secretaries of Ministries of Environment & Forests, Agriculture, Housing and Urban Affairs and Power were also present.

Based on the data provided by state governments, it emerged that the current crisis situation is mainly an account of stubble burning, sources said.

For the period from 15th September to 7th November a total of 22,644 stubble burning events were recorded, out of which 20,976 (93 per cent) were in Punjab and 1,665 (seven per cent) in Haryana.

It also emerged during discussions that harvesting is more than 90 per cent complete in Haryana whereas it is 60 per cent complete in Punjab.

Immediate steps are, therefore, needed to check further stubble burning during the remaining harvesting season, particularly in Punjab, the meeting concluded.

After detailed discussions, the Cabinet Secretary directed the State administration of Punjab to take effective actions to stop further stubble burning, the remaining days of this harvest season.

Responsibility should be fixed on DCs/DMs, SPs and SDOs for ensuring that there is no further stubble burning.

The CAQM should send out flying squads to Punjab, Haryana and submit daily reports on the incidents of farm fires and status of enforcement of directions of the Supreme Court by the DCs/SPs.

The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) should make necessary manpower available to CAQM.

Follow-up actions are to be taken by all State Governments in respect of cases instituted during the last two years for violation of ban on stubble burning. Details of action taken are to be shared with CAQM.

It was also noted that Rs.333 Crores has been released by the Ministry of Agriculture under Crop Residue Management (CRM) scheme so far. Of this, Rs.1531 crore was released to Punjab and Rs.1006 crore to Haryana.

Nearly 1.20 lakh Seeder machines are available under the CRM Scheme in Punjab and 76,000 in Haryana. Optimum utilization of these machines could have prevented stubble burning to such a large extent.

The state governments of Punjab and Haryana were directed to make full use of available Seeder machines to prevent further stubble burning. It was noted that Government of Haryana has been implementing their own incentive scheme for ex-situ management, that is, for procurement of straw from farmers and its transportation, etc. The government of Haryana informed the meeting about an incentive scheme being implemented by them for crop diversification for encouraging farmers to shift from paddy to other crops. The government of Punjab should also launch similar schemes and announce

'Stubble burning can't stop at once'

With the Supreme Court directing the Punjab government to put an end to the practice of stubble burning in order to address the issue of air pollution in the Delhi-NCR region, the Advocate General (AG) Punjab Gurminder Singh on Thursday said the coming weeks would see decline in the state in the cases of paddy stubble burning.

He said the state government has this year brought down the cases of paddy stubble burning to 47 per cent as compared to 70 per cent in 2022.

"The decline in the number of farmers of Punjab who are provided with 30 to 40,000 rupees besides 25 per cent funding by Delhi, 25 per cent by the Union government and 50 per cent by Punjab government, the AG said. "In the case of water of Punjab, we said that farmers must be encouraged to grow crop other than paddy apart from MSP on new crops. This problem can be resolved by going in for crop diversification. We also suggested the purchase of stubble and its usage," he added.

He immediately said stubble burning can be prevented in the remaining part of this year and next year. The government of Haryana should also make efforts to expand and enlarge the scope of their Scheme for ex-situ management to ensure that there is no stubble burning next year.

It was noted that Ministry of Agriculture has launched a Scheme for ex-situ management. All States were asked to ensure effective implementation of this Scheme in their respective States and achieve full utilization of funds

Rajnath Singh directs Defence Ministry to release 3rd instalment of OROP payment before Diwali

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday directed the Ministry of Defence to release the third instalment of the One Rank One Pension (OROP) payment for defence pensioners before Diwali.

The minister also said hanks and other agencies have been directed to the same for all defence pensioners drawing pensions through them.

"Raksha Mantri, Rajnath Singh, has directed the MoD to release the third instalment of OROP payment for the defence pensioners drawing pensions through the SPMSI system before Diwali. The hanks and other agencies have also been directed to the same for all defence pensioners drawing pensions through them," the Defence Minister's Office said in a post on X.

The OROP scheme entails the payment of the same amount of pension to Armed Forces personnel for the same



rank and length of service, irrespective of the date of retirement.

Earlier this year, the Supreme Court directed the government to clear OROP arrears in three equal instalments by February 28, 2024. The directions from the top court came after it pulled up the Centre for "unilateral" decision to pay OROP dues in four instalments.

The Centre's decision was challenged by a group of ex-servicemen in the Supreme Court.

Centre notifies appointment of Justice Manmohan as Acting CJ of Delhi HC

The Union Ministry of Law and Justice on Thursday issued a notification appointing Justice Manmohan as the Acting Chief Justice of the Delhi High Court.

The President appointed Justice Manmohan as the Acting Chief Justice with effect from November 9 consequent upon the elevation of Justice Satish Chandra Sharma, the incumbent Chief Justice of Delhi High Court to the Supreme Court.

"In exercise of the power conferred by Article 223 of the Constitution of India, the President is pleased to appoint Sri Justice Manmohan, Judge of the Delhi High Court, to perform the duties of the office of the Chief Justice of that High Court with effect from the date Mr Justice Satish Chandra Sharma relinquishes the charge as Chief Justice of the Delhi High Court consequent upon his appointment as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India," the notification said.

Justice Manmohan, born in Delhi on December 17, 1962, was appointed as Additional Judge of the Delhi High Court in March 2008.

Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma bids farewell to Delhi HC

Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma on his elevation to the Supreme Court of India bid a heartfelt farewell to the Delhi High Court.

Reflecting on his 15 years on the bench, he expressed gratitude for dealing with cases involving people from various walks of life and parts of society.

Chief Justice Sharma said that his consistent goal was to deliver justice to litigants and expressed satisfaction with the milestones achieved during his judicial journey.

In his farewell speech, Chief Justice Sharma acknowledged the kindness and support that he received



throughout his career, attributing his success to those who guided him.

He pointed out the importance of mutual respect between the bar and bench, emphasising their shared goal of delivering justice.

Chief Justice Sharma, a first-generation lawyer, recounted his legal journey from the Madhya Pradesh High Court to the Karnataka High Court, Telangana High Court, and eventually the Delhi High Court.

His elevation to the Supreme Court was recommended by the Supreme Court Collegium and notified by the Union government. He highlighted the significance of alleviating the sufferings of litigants and upholding their rights as the hallmark of justice.

He also served as Senior Panel Advocate for the Centre in the Delhi High Court and Supreme Court. In his private practice, he handled various important cases including Dabhal Power Company vs. Esar and Azim's executorship matter, Claridges Hotel dispute, Modi Family as well as Gujarat Ambuja Cement's sales tax and Fohpur Suez encroachment matter.

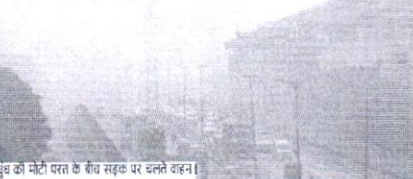
