Bomb threat in Kerala Secretariat turns out to be a hoax

A bomb threat caused some anxious moments at the Kerala government Secretariat, the seat of power that houses the offices of Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and other state ministers on Thursday. However, the threat that a bomb had been planted at the Kerala Secretariat turned out to be a hoax.

The police headquarters received a threat call at 11.30 am. The caller threatened to blow up the Secretariat using explosives.

As soon as the call came, Kerala Police bomb detection and disposal squad scanned the building and its precincts with electronic detectors and sniffer dogs.

The police also searched vehicles parked outside the premises for hidden explosives.

However, no explosives were found and it was revealed that the call was fake.

The police soon rounded up a 30-year-old man from Pothiyoor near the city for allegedly making the threat call. The police said he was mentally challenged and had no sinister intention behind making the threatening call.

Centres as Punjab to stop stubble burning

38% of air pollution in Delhi and neighbouring areas was found to be contributed by stubble burning

An emergency meeting held by Cabinet Secretary Rajy Gauba has found that 38 per cent of air pollution in the national capital and neighbouring areas was contributed by stubble burning on 8 November.

The meeting chaired by the Cabinet Secretary was held as per the direction of the Supreme Court. Chief secretaries and other senior officers of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan, and the NCT of Delhi attended the meeting.

The chairman, Commission on Air Quality Management (CAQM) and secretaries of Ministries of Environment & Forests, Agriculture, Housing and Urban Affairs and Power were also present.

Based on the data provided by the CAQM and inputs provided by state governments, it emerged that the current stubble burning situation is majorly on account of stubble burning sources said.

For the period from 15th September to 7th November, a total of 22,444 stubble burning events were recorded, out of which 207.93 per cent were in Punjab and 146 (seven per cent) in Haryana.

It also emerged during discussions that harvesting is more than 90 per cent complete in Haryana whereas it is 60 per cent complete in Punjab.

After detailed discussions, the Cabinet Secretary directed the State administration of Punjab to take effective actions to stop further stubble burning during the remaining harvesting season, particularly in Punjab, the meeting concluded.

Responsibility should be fixed on DCO/DMA, SSBs and SHO for ensuring that there is no further stubble burning.

The CAQM should send out flying squads to Punjab & Haryana and submit daily reports on the incidents of stubble burning to the Secretaries of Punjab & Haryana were directed to make full use of available

to 70 per cent in 2022.

“Filing the affidavit on behalf of Punjab, we contended that the farmers of Punjab need to be provided with 30 to 40,000 machines besides 25 per cent funding by Delhi, 25 per cent by the Union government and 50 per cent by Punjab government,” the AG said. “On the issue of waters of Punjab, we said that the farmers must be encouraged to grow crops other than paddy apart from MSP on new crops.”

This problem can be resolved by going in for crop diversification. He also suggested the purchase of stubble and its usage,” he added.

He also suggested that stubble burning can be prevented in the remaining part of this year and next year. The government of Haryana should also make efforts to expand and enlarge the scope of their Scheme of stubble management to ensure that there is no stubble burning next year.

It was noted that Ministry of Agriculture has launched a Scheme for ex-situ crop residue management. All States were asked to ensure effective implementation of this scheme in their respective States and achieve full utilization of funds.

Murmu said that women in Uttarakhand and other parts of India have played a crucial role in strengthening the nation and upholding its culture. Applauding the state's contributions in the defence forces, Murmu said, “Uttarakhand is a land of warriors. Bravehearts from Uttarakhand have brought war for the nation post inde-

pendence. Salute those heroes and brave warriors. They are the Indian Army in joining the Indian Army to protect mother India. Indian Army's Kumaon and Garwal regiments are named after two regiments of the state who have sacrificed their lives for the glory of the nation.”

The President was on a three-day visit to Uttarakhand to participate in celebrations at Pant Nagar Agriculture University and Hemnand Nandan Bahuguna State Open University. On Wednesday, she visited the Badrinath temple and offered prayers with devotees under the guidance of chief priest Bhalvi Prasad Nambudiri.

Rajnath Singh directs Defence Ministry to release 3rd instalment of OROP payment before Diwali

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday directed the Ministry of Defence to release the third instalment of the One Rank One Pension (OROP) payment for defence pensioners before Diwali.

The minister also said banks and other agencies have been directed to do the same for all defence pensioners drawing pensions through them.

Rajkumar Moorti, Rajnath Singh, has directed to increase the third instalment of OROP payment for the defence pensioners drawing pensions through the PARSI System before Diwali.

The minister also said banks and other agencies have been directed to do the same for all defence pensioners drawing pensions through them.

The OROP scheme entails the payment of the same amount of pension to Armed Forces personnel for the same



rank and length of service irrespective of the date of retirement.

Earlier this year, the Supreme Court asked the government to clear OROP arrears in three equal instalments by February 28, 2024.

The Supreme Court directed that the 6 lakh family pensioners and grant-in-aid pensioners should be paid their OROP dues by April 30, 2023.

About 5 lakh retired servicemen aged 70 years and above should be given their

dues in one or more instalments by June 30.

The rest, 10-11 lakh pensioners, should receive their arrears in three instalments by February 28, 2024.

The Centre's decision was challenged by a group of servicemen in the Supreme Court.

The President appointed Justice Manmohan as the Acting Chief Justice with effect from November 9 consequent upon the elevation of Justice Satish Chandra Sharma, the incumbent Chief Justice of Delhi High Court.

In exercise of the power conferred by Article 223 of the Constitution of India, the President is pleased to appoint Shri Justice Manmohan, Judge of the Delhi High Court, to perform the duties of the office of the Chief Justice of that High Court with effect from the date Shri Justice Satish Chandra Sharma relinquishes the charge as Chief Justice of the Delhi High Court consequent upon his appointment as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India (the notification said).

Justice Manmohan, born in Delhi on December 17, 1962, was appointed as Additional Judge of the Delhi High Court in March 2006.
